CORE MATERIALS AND ACTIVITIES FOR EARLY CHILDHOOD PROGRAMS

The intent of this checklist is to provide Montessori teacher education programs with a list of traditional developmentally appropriate activities that Montessori teachers of children ages 2 1/2 through 6 years are generally expected to be able to present in their classrooms. This list is comprehensive but not exclusive or prescriptive and teacher education program instructors may also present other activities.

* Starred items indicate additional suggested materials or activities that may not be available at a school site, but will contribute to a new teacher's understanding of Montessori curriculum.
